10-Day Spring Grizzly Bear Gear List

In April Interior Alaska's temperature ranges are usually -10 to 40 degrees.

Dry Bags: Everything should fit in these 3 dry bags—minus weapon

1 Large Dry Bag--Seal Line 115L Boundry Portage—for boots, sleeping bag, pad, and other large items

2 Medium Dry Bags—Seal Line 30L clear SEE—for clothes and small items

Clothing: (NO COTTON) everything synthetic or fleece--brown, green, or camo color.

Socks, 4-6 pairs—Synthetic blend or smart wool/Darn Tough

Underwear/Boxers, 2 pairs—synthetic

Base layers/thermals, 2 sets—all synthetic

Mid Layer, light weight & heavy weight, 1 set each—synthetic or fleece

Outer layer, 2 pants, 1 jacket—fleece waterproof (quiet) I use Browning Hydro Fleece

Overwhites—solid white or camo/white pattern

Clothing Accessories

Camp Shoes, Insulated hunting boot—bunny boots are preferred—I have some for you

Gloves-4 pair: 2 Lightweight, 2 Heavy weight--waterproof

Hats: 1 each: brimmed & stocking hat, neck gaiter

Sleeping bag: synthetic, **(NO COTTON OR DOWN)** rated to 0 degrees—in waterproof compression sack

I have used the Big Agnes Farwell for years. The pad goes in the bag—you can't roll off the pad.

Sleeping Pad: closed cell Thermarest

MISC: Pocketknife, Leatherman, Sunglasses, Binoculars, Hygeine Kit, Chapstick, 100 Baby wipes, Lens cleaning cloth, 5 gun cleaning wipes, 20 day supply of medicine, Headlamp and small flashlight, Book, Water bottle/Nalgene, Waterproof Camera, 50 feet of para cord, spare batteries, range finder, 30 hand & feet warmers

Rifle, synthetic stock, .30-06 or larger with quality scope—variable 3-9 power with 50mm bell

Walking/shooting stick—make sure it is not noisy when walking through woods.

Small day pack
